My family would like to urge the PA House of Representatives to produce a fair and just bill to address this ruling. This ruling seems to have no compassion for the victims or the families of the victims.

These people sentenced to life either pled guilty or were convicted in a court of their peers to these heinous crimes. Life in prison for most of them was a very fair sentence. He received life in prison for the murder, and 10 years for the theft of Todd's gun. He shot my brother numerous times in the back at this shooting range just to steal his gun.

The man filed numerous motions and appeals over the last 16 years, and they have all been denied. He was 64 years old when he committed this heinous murder. He has been incarcerated for 16 years. My brother has been gone for the same 16 years, but he didn't get life, he got death.

Our family does not think this man deserves or should be eligible for resentencing, parole, pardon or commutation of the heinous crime he committed.

Our family will never see Todd again. His wife will never have Todd by her side again, have a conversation, a hug, or kiss again. His son will never know how wonderful his father was, he was only 6 when his father was murdered, he is now 21. Todd will be forever 42 and never know how his son has grown into a wonderful man.

The family is pleading with the Legislature to stop this Supreme Court ruling and produce a bill to address this 2nd degree murder resentencing ruling.
